Cadets will be given equivalent AFJROTC ribbons to wear in lieu of Army, Navy, Marine Corps, or Coast Guard Junior ROTC ribbons/medals the cadet earned while serving in sisterservice JROTC program. It is up to the SASI to make the best determination as to what equivalent AFJROTC

Ribbon Devices. Cadets may earn oak leaf clusters for the subsequent award of the same ribbon. Oak leaf's come in single, double, triple and quadruple bronze devices indicating the 2nd, 3rd, 4th and 5th award of the same ribbon respectively. A single silver oak leaf is used to indicate the 6th award of the same ribbon. Bronze and Silver stars may be earned for special achievements as indicated in the ribbon descriptions section previously. All oak leaf devices on ribbons must be displayed at the same angle. Devices are easily lost form ribbons, especially by taking off/putting on backpacks. If you lose a ribbon device, see your flight logistics specialist or an instructor for replacement.

AIR FORCE JUNIOR ROTC--BADGES (Descriptions and Criteria)



This annual award consists of a certificate and the Distinguished AFJROTC Cadet badge. The award recognizes one outstanding third-year cadet selected at the end of each school year. The recipient must be of high moral character, demonstrate positive personal attributes, display outstanding military potential, and maintain consistent academic and military excellence. The SASI, in coordination with the ASI and with the concurrence of the principal, selects the recipient of this award. The recipient will hold the following awards prior to selection: Leadership Ribbon, Achievement Ribbon, Superior Performance Ribbon, Academic Ribbon, Leadership Development Requirement Ribbon, and Service Ribbon. This award is present to the incoming NC-075th Corps Commander.



Academic Cadet Badge— Awarded to rising Junior and Senior cadets for academic excellence as signified by attaining a minimum 3.3 grade point average (GPA) with no grade below a 2.0 GPA on their transcript. The individuals must be recommended by the SASI.



Awarded to cadets who have fulfilled model rocketry program requirements. NC-075th Program requirements are: Successfully complete the Rocketry Test, demonstrate ability to hold all duty positions such as but not limited to: safety officer, etc., and successful launch and recover their rocket three times.

AIR FORCE JUNIOR ROTC---SHOULDER TABS (Descriptions and Criteria)

Shoulder tabs are either cloth or metal arches denoting participation in an AFJROTC activity. Shoulder tabs are optional. If worn, cadets are authorized to wear one shoulder tab on the right shoulder of the service dress coat and the light blue shirt, centered between the unit patch and the shoulder seam. Tabs will have the name of the activity on them (e.g., drill team, saber team, honor guard, etc.). If no unit patch is worn, tab will be worn no lower than 1 inch

below the shoulder seam. If a unit patch is worn, shoulder tab will be centered between the unit patch and the shoulder seam. The following LDR/Activities as such but are not limited have been designated by the SASI to wear: Drill, Honor Guard, Color Guard, Honor Roll, Raider. The SASI may approve additional tabs as submitted. NOTE: Some LDRs may have no shoulder tab or even a should cord, some may have both. Some teams even are authorized a beret. Currently, the Color Guard wears white berets, and Drill Team members wear dark blue, and the RAIDER team wears black. Cadets are encouraged to earn shoulder tabs and wear them on their Mountaineer Grit Letter Jacket...aka. Spirit Jacket.

AIR FORCE JUNIOR ROTC--RANK INSIGNIA (Descriptions and Criteria)



Cadet Officers and enlisted may wear the highly polished/chrome Hap Arnold Wings or the large highly polished/chrome Cadet Officer Insignia on the Service Cap (wheel and bucket hats). Cadet Officers may ONLY wear either AFJROTC rank insignia or mini-Hap Arnold Insignia pin on the beret. Enlisted cadets may ONLY wear the highly polished/chrome Hap Arnold Wings.



Cadet Officers may wear the highly polished/chrome Cadet Officer Insignia on the Service Cap (wheel and bucket hats).



The expert badge - requires a combined score of 250 or above, fired in the prone, standing, and kneeling 3x10 positions. The sharpshooter badge - requires a combined score of 220 or above, fired in the prone, standing, and kneeling 3x10 positions. The basic marksmanship badge - requires a combined score of 170 or above, fired in the prone, standing, and kneeling 3x10 positions.

Marksmanship competition awards/badges may be worn on the AFJROTC uniform. Males and females will wear the badge (may only wear one) below the ribbons on the blue shirt or service dress uniform. Marksmanship badges will not be worn with medals. Each Marksmanship athlete may earn one of the three marksmanship badges. They may only wear one of the badges on the uniform, not more than one at a time. These badges are earned by scores obtained in competitions, not practices. These badges are awarded by the instructors.

The Civilian Marksmanship Program's (CMP) Junior Distinguished Badges (Gold, Silver and Bronze) are awarded to cadets who distinguish themselves by attaining a series of high rankings in designated major junior air rifle championships that include State Junior Olympic Qualifiers, CMP Cup Matches, the National Junior Olympic Championships and other National Council Three- Position Air Rifle Championships.
