# PLANNING CALENDAR

### Spring

- It is to leave the set of the set public, private, urban, rural, etc. Meet with an admissions counselor to find out more about the college and what that particular setting can offer you.
- Narrow down choices and learn more about those colleges of interest in terms of majors offered, cost, scholarship opportunities, etc.
- (1) If you are considering military academies or ROTC scholarships, contact your counselor before leaving school for the summer. If you want a four-year ROTC scholarship, you should begin the application process the summer before your senior year.
- D Register for classes. Make sure you have all requirements for colleges that you are interested in. Some out of state colleges may have different requirements such as 3 units of a foreign language or an arts credit. Also consider North Carolina Academic Scholars requirements if this is an honor you wish to obtain.

#### Summer

- If you are an athlete planning to continue playing a sport in college, you **must** register with the NCAA Clearinghouse at www.ncaaclearinghouse.net
- D Participate in volunteer work, full-time or part-time job, summer camp, or summer college program.
- ① Continue updating your Portfolio of Activities.
- Download applications from colleges to which you'll apply. Check application dates—large universities may have early dates or rolling admissions.
