Graduation Requirements

- English (4 credits) English I, English II, English III, English IV
 Mathematics (4 credits)
 - Math I, Math II, Math III, Additional Math
- Science (3 credits)
 - Physical Science or Chemistry, Earth & Environmental Science, & Biology
- Social Studies (4 credits)
 World History, Civics & Economics, American History I & American History II
- Health & PE (1 credit)



Elective Credits

Electives or Other Requirements (6 credits) 2 Elective credits of any combination from either:

- Career & Technical Ed.(CTE)
- Arts Education
- Second Language (2 years required to meet minimum admission requirement for public colleges in NC)

4 Elective credits (four course concentration) from one of the following:

- Career & Technical Education (CTE)
- JROTC
- Arts Education
- Any other subject area (Math, Science, English, Foreign Language, etc.)



North Carolina Academic Scholars

The North Carolina Academic Scholars Program

is an effort to recognize those students who have excelled in academics. The students who meet this criteria will be recognized in the graduation program and will receive a gold seal on their diploma.

GPA: 3.5 Unweighted

- 4 English I, II, III, IV
- 4 Mathematics Math I, Math II, Math III & and a math course with Math III as the prerequisite.
- **3** Science Physics or Chemistry course, Biology, and Earth & Environmental Science
- 4 **Social Studies -** World History, Civics & Economics, American History I & American History II
- **1** Health and Physical Education
- 2 Languages other than English (required for the UNC System)
- 4 Electives Four course concentration recommended from one of the following: Career & Technical Education, JROTC, Arts Education, or Academic
- **3** Elective credits includes 3 additional credits in "higher level courses" taken during junior &/or senior years which carry 5 or 6 quality point.

Things To Think About

• Foreign Language – Not required for graduation but <u>Needed</u> for the UNC System Schools.

• Promotion Requirements –

- To enter the 10th grade, a student must have earned a minimum of 5 units of credit with 1 being English.
- To enter the 11th grade, a student must have earned a minimum of 10 units of credit with 2 being in English.
- To enter the 12th grade, a student must have earned a minimum of 17 units of credit with 2 being in English.

AP CLASSES (Face-to-Face)

- O All AP classes will be taught in the FALL semester.
 - Time for all curriculum to be covered
 - AP classes on mid-year transcript
- Students will attend required SMART Lunch and study sessions in SPRING semester to prepare for AP Exam
- MUST TAKE AP EXAM
- Ourrently worth 6 points

HONORS CLASSES

Offered at each grade level

 Require more independent work and reading

Currently worth 5 points

FACTORS AFFECTING # of SECTIONS AND MEMBERSHIP

- # of students who register
 - Registration commits student to class if it makes. Schedules will not be changed unless there is an unavoidable conflict
- Impact on other class sizes
 - Student/Teacher Ratio

APPLICATION PROCESS

- **Step 1**: Students must meet qualifying grade prerequisite and complete the APPLICATION OF INTENT form online.
- Step 2: Placement Criteria Used to determine student rank
 - Teacher Recommendation (based on rubric)
 - EOC Score (Most recent)
 - Grade (converted to a 1-4 scale) in current class in that subject
 - North Carolina Final Exam (if applicable)
- Latest test will be reviewed to determine if student ranking should be adjusted based on new score.
- This criteria is NOT for rising 9th graders who have taken English 1 and/or Math 1
