### Course Description

In this course students experience the cross-section of nutrition science and food preparation, while building skills for an expanding range of career opportunities. Emphasis is placed on health and social responsibility while improving the way people eat. Students explore food protection, nutrition's, life cycle nutrition, sports nutrition, medical nutrition therapy, and American and global food ways. English/language arts, social studies, mathematics, science, technology, interpersonal relationships are reinforced. Work-based learning strategies appropriate for this course include apprenticeship, cooperative education, entrepreneurship, internship, mentorship, school-based enterprise, service learning and job shadowing. Family, Career and Community Leaders of America (FCCLA) competitive events, community service, and leadership activities provide the opportunity to apply essential standards and workplace readiness skills through authentic experiences.

### Required Materials Needed

- ✓ **2 ½ or 3" 3-ring binder (No spiral Notebooks or Composition notebooks) Must have everyday**
- ✓ **1 set of 4 Dividers (tabs)**
- ✓ **Pen/pencil (MUST have every day for class)**
- ✓ **Chrome Book must be charged and brought with you. You must have it especially for tests**
- ✓ **Hair Net for Labs (Teacher will provide one per student. If you should lose yours/ruin it will be **.50 cents to replace** your hair net. Failure to do so will result in a Zero (0) for that Lab grade. Hairnets must be always worn during Labs to participate. This is part of Safety and Sanitation in the kitchen labs.)**

### Attendance Policy

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### THE "BE" RULES

1. **BE PROMPT**- be on time for class
2. **BE PREPARED**- have your pencil and binder every day and ready to start class (sometimes Chromebooks)
3. **BE POLITE**- use your manners! Please, thank you, excuse me, etc....

### Cell Phone Policy

- NO Cell Phones in class or in the kitchen labs. Per new NC State Legislation, no cell phones are to be used during instructional time. Phones will need to be kept in your backpack. This includes all electronic devices, ear buds/headphones and Smart watches.
- Smart Watches- Be respectful and don't be texting from them or they will need to be put with your phone.
- **Automatic referral for having cell phone in the classroom/lab area or use of other electronic devices (smart watches) not approved by the teacher in class. Whether you are using it or not it should be in your backpack.**

### PROCEDURES

1. Backpacks and other bags must be kept in the designated area and not on top of table or counters.
2. Binders and pencils should be on your table prior to the tardy bell.
3. Students are not to line up at the door. Stay at your table until the bell rings.
4. Use of the restroom should occur between classes. Students should refrain from using the restroom during class time unless it is an **emergency**. If you must go during class, **ask before just leaving the room** and make sure to use the Smart Pass kiosk to sign in/out. ONLY one student at a time may use the bathroom.
5. **Students are not allowed to be in the kitchen labs except during lab times.**
6. **Students are not allowed to be in or use the classroom refrigerators.**
7. **All students are required to taste test all foods/beverages made in the classroom. Exception is a Doctor documented allergy in Infinite Campus. This is a participation grade. This is a participation grade and counts 2x.**
8. **Dress code for labs: you are required to wear closed toe shoes in labs. No sleeveless shirts or overly baggy clothing, it is a safety precaution.**
9. **Labs are privilege not a right**

ANY DISRESPECT DIRECTED TOWARD THE TEACHER OR ANOTHER STUDENT WILL NOT BE TOLERATED. ANY ABUSE OF THE EQUIPMENT IN THE ROOM WILL RESULT IN AN AUTOMATIC REFERRAL TO THE OFFICE.
