#### • English (4 Credits) –

- English I, English II, English III, English IV
- Mathematics (4 credits)
  - Math I, Math II, Math III, & an Additional Math Beyond Math III

#### • Science (3 credits) –

• Earth & Environmental Science, Biology, & a Physical Science Course

#### Social Studies (4 credits) -

- World History, Civics & Economics, & American History I & II
  OR
- Honors World History, Honors Civics, AP US History and one History Elective

#### • PE & Health (1 credit)

### Future Ready Curriculum

#### • Electives or Other Requirements (6 credits)

#### • 2 Elective credits of any combination from either:

- Career and Technical Education
- Arts Education
- Second Language
- 4 Elective credits (four course concentration) strongly recommended from one of the following:

### North Carolina Academic Scholars

The North Carolina Academic Scholars Program is an effort to recognize those students who have excelled in academics. The students who meet this criteria will be recognized in the graduation program and will receive a gold seal on their diploma.

#### GPA: 3.5 Unweighted

#### **Requirements for NC Academic Scholars**

- English (4 credits) English I, English II, English III, English IV
- Math (4 credits) Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and a math beyond Algebra II
- Science (3 credits) Earth & Environmental Science, Biology, and A Physical Science
- Social Studies (4 credits) World History, Civics & Economics, and US History I & II
- Health & Physical Education (1 credit)
- Second Language (2 credits) Two (2) elective credits in a second language required for the UNC System.
- Elective Credits (4 credits) Four (4) elective credits constituting a concentration recommended from one of the following: Career and Technical Education (CTE), JROTC, Arts Education, Second Languages, any other subject area.
- Image: Higher Level Courses (3 credits) Three credits taken during junior and/or senior years which carry 5 or 6 quality points such as: -AP -IB -Dual or college equivalent course -Advanced CTE/CTE credentialing courses -On-line courses Other honors or above designated courses
