The "novel" section is the part where you get to practice taking apart literature and noticing these allusions before entering the class. Because of this, it is suggested to read the allusion selections first. You will have a test beginning on day 1 of the year with the Allusion section, and the tests on the rest of the reading happening over the first week in class.
