Principal's News

A lot of good things are happening at Clyde Elementary. In spite of many missed days due to bad weather conditions, teachers and students alike are working hard and lots of learning is taking place in our classrooms.

Several new or different programs have been introduced this school year. The local Kiawanis Club introduced and are sponsoring an incentive program, Bringing up Grades (BUGS) for our Third Grade students, recognizing those who maintain or bring up grades this school year. The benchmark was set at the end of the first nine weeks grading period, and students are recognized each nine weeks thereafter for the rest of the school year if they maintain or bring up grades. Many thanks to our local Kiawanians for supporting student achievement.

The receipt of a grant from NC Department of Public Instruction has provided Clyde Elementary with the opportunity and resources to initiate the **3D Reading Diagnostic Assessment** that is being utilized in several elementary schools across the county. This assessment tool allows teachers to track reading proficiency and understanding more closely than ever before, through the use of this computerized assessment.

We are now offering additional support to students and classroom teachers through the use of Title I funds to work with students in math. Using funds to support math instruction allows teachers and Title I staff to provide additional time and instruction to students with a lower ratio of instructor to student.

Latchkey is now providing certified Clyde staff to support the Homework Club. The club meets Monday through Thursday afternoons to assist students who wish to complete assignments while in Latchkey.

You will be hearing more about the newly formed book club, **Book Hounds**, which has created a good bit of excitement around campus!

Clyde Elementary offers many opportunities beyond academics for our students. **Girls on the Run** is a big hit with 3-5 girls as is the **Boys' Running** Club for 3-5 boys.

Kindergarten then started preparing for our Valentine's Day. It turned into the biggest celebration of the year. The entire kindergarten class made individual holders for their cards. The students had parties in their room, read books and made cards for their families. Valentine's Day is a great resource for using hearts with sorting and sharing with others.

On February 21, students celebrated President's Day. Students learned about George Washington and Abraham Lincoln.

First Grade News

First grade students have been very busy learners this month. We have enjoyed the many holidays and events in February. We started off the month anxiously waiting to see if the groundhog would see his shadow. Thanks to our new SMARTBoards, the class watched this event and received the news—"The sky is clear. Prepare for warmth!" With those rousing words, the world's famous groundhog, Punxsutawney Phil, offered a ray of hope. By seeing no shadow as he emerged from his burrow, Phil is said to have predicted an early spring.

Second Grade News

This is a very exciting time of the year for second grade! The children are working hard in our balanced literacy program. They are reading independently from a variety of selfselected fiction and non-fiction books at their own levels. They continue to receive instruction at the appropriate level in their guided reading groups. The students are going to be exploring the characteristics of the nonfiction genre such as table of contents, indexes, diagrams, labels, subheadings, captions and glossaries.

Each night, as you read with your child, remember to talk to him/her about the books they are reading to ensure comprehension of the book. Ask questions about the author's main idea, character traits, problem and solution and any connections he/she may have to the story. Again, the SMARTBoard was useful in comparing and contrasting these two presidents. All kindergarten students made hats to wear to lunch for this special day. They also talked about our current president.

Dental health is a theme for this month and we will be talking about the importance of brushing properly and using dental floss. We have started assessing students with the new 3D Reading Program and all students are now reading from the Kindergarten Sight Word books.

We encourage parents to read nightly with their child and to talk about their understanding of the books they bring home. We are excited about our field trip to see the Dr. Seuss Play and to celebrate St. Patrick's Day.

Our 100th day celebration included 100 shaped glasses, 100 items brought in by students to practice math concepts, 100 shaped snacks and writing activities that included practice with the number sense of 100. It's amazing what you can find in 100s!

For Valentine's Day, each student created folders using many different art mediums to express their individuality and uniqueness. Students also celebrated with a party and exchanged valentines with each other. Students thoughtfully remembered others outside their immediate classroom on this special day.

The children are working on writing personal narratives that include a clear beginning, middle and end that is loaded with lots of details. The students have now started to explore the exciting world of cursive handwriting as well!

In math, students will be working on telling time, counting money and fractions. They will continue to use their addition and subtraction skills to solve real life word problems. The students will also learn how to represent data in pictographs and Venn diagrams.

We would like to thank all of you for the support that you give your precious children and the school to make the most out of this second grade school experience. We appreciate all you do and look forward to a wonderful rest of the year!
