## Title 1 News

Title I Staff would like to say a huge "thank you" to parents and students who attended "March into Curriculum Night". Since we are celebrating Dr. Seuss's birthday this month, it is a great time to celebrate reading and writing and other curriculum areas.

We would like to challenge your student to read and write more this month than they have previously during the school year. We would love for your child to share with us in the Title I room by bringing by their reading log and any written responses they are working on at home.

Fluency in math is a huge challenge for students. In Kindergarten, students should be mastering "subitizing", the ability to recognize the dot pattern on dice without counting. As students move into first grade, they should be able to make combinations of ten. Students should be memorizing basic addition and subtraction facts by the end of second grade. Third grade students should be working on multiplication facts – memorizing facts to 10. Fourth grade reviews and adds the 11's and 12's facts. Memorization of facts is important for understanding of fraction concepts in fourth and fifth grade. Please continue to play the math shaker games you learned at curriculum night. These games will help build fluency for students with basic facts.
