Title 1 News Great Gift Ideas For Christmas

Reading – books (both non-fiction and fiction)

Students need to be reading a variety of genres. For non-fiction, try to find recipes, "how to" books or articles, magazines, etc. For fiction, do the same, fairy tales, fables, adventure, historical fiction, science fiction, etc. **Math** – playing cards, dice, a watch – not digital, play money, flash cards, wrap-ups, etc.

Students need to work on fluency and automaticity in math. This means the ability to recall basic facts quickly. Take two playing cards and have students find the sum, difference, and product of these numbers. For quotients, use two playing cards to make a 2 digit number to start with and then draw a card for the divisor. You can repeat using dice. Follow up with flash cards – practice and post 2 facts a day. Your child says those two facts several times throughout the day. It won't take long for your child to be able to tell you the fact without even having to think about it.

Dice are great for number recognition and for fraction work. Students can make proper and improper fractions. Students can use the dice to create a fraction as division problem as well.

Many students have trouble counting money quickly. Practice with play money. You can follow up by letting your child use real money to purchase a toy or item at the store. Later, work on making change when purchasing items.

Many students do not know how to read an analog clock, a clock face including the hour, minute, and second hand. How quick is a minute? An hour?
