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What is Title I?

Junaluska Elementary is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop with parents and family members a written parent and family engagement policy.

SCHOOL PLAN FOR SHARED STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Junaluska Elementary School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. Junaluska Elementary School values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Junaluska Elementary School will support parent and family engagement and how parents and family members can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

Junaluska Elementary School invited all parents and/or family members to provide written feedback last spring (April 2018 and June 2018) to review and revise our school-parent and family engagement compact, this parent and family engagement policy, as well as the schoolwide plan, four key roles of parent and family engagement, and the parent and family engagement budget. Additionally, parent and family input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year by contacting our school parent and family engagement coordinator, Marlene Creary. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distributed an annual survey to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement (June 6, 2018). Parents and family members can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities during the school year including our Title I events.

Who is it for? Everyone!

Our school is a participating Title I School, so all parents and students participate in Title I; this includes events, funding and policy decisions, etc. All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Junaluska Elementary School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the beginning of the year packet that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will review the plan with parents and family members at the Annual Meeting. The plan will also be posted on the school website.

SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACTS

Open House & Curriculum Night – Tuesday, September 11, 2018

(K-2 from 3:30 pm until 4:30 pm) (3-5 from 5:00 pm until 6:00 pm)

Get an overview of the curriculum for your child’s school year. This will include information on assessments and testing for the school year as well. You will not want to miss this important event. Afterwards, you will be able to schedule a time for a fall conference with your child’s teacher and to tour the room and look at work samples representing your child.

Gain knowledge about mclass assessments for K-3 students and ways to help your child improve reading skills. Gain knowledge about teacher’s college assessments for students in 4-5 and ways to help with comprehension and vocabulary development.

Science Night – Spring 2019 (TBA due to grant decision)

Connect with the school and community to build a better understanding of important science concepts.

Band of Brothers – Spring 2019

Parent Appreciation – May 2019 (TBA due to testing window)

A celebration of family engagement and the recognition of its impact on school and student success.

School Forum – April 2019

A forum for parents and family members to participate in roundtable discussions with the principal and staff regarding the schoolwide plan, parent and family engagement policy, school-parent and family engagement compacts, four key roles of parent and family engagement, and the parent and family engagement budget.

Junaluska Elementary School will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will:

- ✓ Ensure that information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is published in both English and Spanish. Information will be posted on the school website, included in the monthly school newsletter, shared through the phone messaging system, and/or through the agenda book for parents and family members.
- ✓ Provide a training for staff at the beginning of the year to educate our staff on the importance of parent and family engagement and how to support student learning, including strategies to improve communication with parents and ideas to increase family engagement with reading and math activities for our students outside of the classroom. Staff will also share best practices during regularly scheduled faculty meetings or PLCs (Professional Learning Community) meetings.
