What is it?

Our school is a participating Title I School, so all parents and students participate in Title I; this includes events, funding and policy decisions, etc. All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Junaluska Elementary School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children.

Where is it available?

At the beginning of the year, the plan is included in the beginning of the year packet that is given to all students. As a reminder, we will review the plan with parents and family members at the Annual Meeting. The plan will also be posted on the school website.

- 5: Operations with Fractions

Parent and Family Engagement Resources

According to surveys, resources to use at home were a top priority. New, this year we will be making materials and activities available for checkout after training sessions at school. Currently, a small section of the Title I room has been set up as a parent resource mini-center. Math flash cards for grades 1-5 are available for checkout. Math games for grades 3-5 are also available for checkout. Items may be checked out before or after school or by contacting Marlene Creary.

Let's Get Together!

Junaluska Elementary School will host monthly events throughout the school year to build the capacity for strong family engagement to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement.

Meeting times for events vary based on input from parent and family engagement surveys. Brunch events will be held between 10:00 am and 11:30 am. Lunch events will be held between 12:00 pm and 1:00 pm. Other events may be held right after school or later in the evening.
